### Chicago Board of Education Approves Second School at Pope Elementary

The Chicago Board of Education approved the establishment of Burroughs II Elementary School and

the recommended site at Pope Elementary, located at 1852 S. Albany in North Lawndale. The new performance school, scheduled to open at the beginning of the 2008-09 school year as part of Chicago Public Schools' (CPS) Renaissance 2010 program, will share space with Pope through the 2009-2010 school year and then move to its permanent location in Brighton Park.

Parents, teachers and school administrators at Pope, however, disapprove of the Board's decision because the move would hinder Pope's academic progress and force the school to reduce vital programs. Burroughs II will occupy the third floor of the building.

"We don't need no more kids here. This school is just enough for our kids. We have only one floor, all those kids don't need to be here. There won't be any room for all those kids. The school only has a hundred and something kids it used to be about 300," said Vivian Green, whose daughter and granddaughter attend Pope.

"The Board made the decision for Burroughs II Elementary School without considering the impact on impact of their decision on Pope's programs," said Pope Principal Jacqueline Baker. "We have been able to provide an environment that is conducive to learning. We have been able to prepare our children to be competitive in the world outside."

Baker said that during her 11 year tenure the school has made significant academic gains. Pope, according to Baker, was in the bottom 10 schools among CPS Elementary schools. The school's progress, said Baker, would be hindered because Pope's successful technology, reading and art programs, located on the school's

### Happy 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday – Garfield Park Conservatory (1908-2008)

Garfield Park Conservatory celebrated its 100<sup>th</sup> year on the Westside of Chicago by combining a lively theme of "Blues and Greens."

The Garfield Park Conservatory in Chicago, Illinois is one of the largest and most stunning conservatories in the nation. Often referred to as "landscape art under glass," the Garfield Park Conservatory occupies approximately 4.5 acres inside and out, and includes cold frames where thousands of plants are grown each year for displays in city parks and spaces.

In 1905, Chicago's West Park Commission's general superintendent and chief landscape architect, Jens Jensen, demolished the three smaller greenhouses in Humboldt, Douglas and Garfield Parks to create what was intended as "the largest publicly owned conservatory under one roof in the world" in Garfield Park. Many of the

original plantings came from the three smaller Westside conservatories.

Jensen conceived the Conservatory as a series of naturalistic landscapes under glass, a revolutionary idea at the time.

Located in the midst of historic Garfield Park on Chicago's redeveloping West Side, the Garfield Park Conservatory is one of Chicago's best kept secrets and is one of the nation's botanical treasures. It ranks among Chicago's most unique sites, attracting visitors from a variety of cultures, disciplines and interests.

Garfield Park Conservatory celebrated its 100th year on the West side of Chicago on April 13 as hundreds of people of all ages, races and communities flowed through the brightly colored Azaleas beautifully planted amongst rare and plants as the "Robin Watson Blues Band," music swept through the halls.

Visitors munched on an endless supply of popcorn, hotdogs and

cupcakes and children decorated birthday hats, created a birthday terrarium and seed shakers along with volunteers for storytelling at this bubbly event.

There is still a great economic inequality. Being financially, unwise and uneducated, has created an uncountable loss for many in our coverage area.

The National Black Caucus of States Institute.(NBCSI) recognizes that while personal finance is important to everyone—lack of personal financial knowledge, increased debt and access to financial services has had a negatively disproportional impact on families—particularly African American families with limited resources.

Data indicate the overwhelming gap of economic resources as African Americans lag in home and business ownership, lack of savings accounts and lower credit scores.

There are alarming statistics that help frame these concerns:

- · According to the Corporation for Enterprise Development 60% of African American families have zero or negative net financial assets.
- The average Black household has 54 cents of income and 12 cents of wealth for every dollar earned and held by whites
- $\cdot$  In the United States, 10% of the families control 90 % of financial wealth.
- A consumer with a low credit score of 560 compared to a consumer with a high credit score of 720 will pay approximately \$400 a month more or \$4,800 more a year if they qualify for a loan.
- · A disproportionate number of low credit scores are found in predominantly African American communities.

If there is going to be long-term improvement in this situation, NBCSI believes that it will begin with economic

### AT THE FLICKS

#### THE FORBIDDEN KINGDOM (\*\*1/2)

The latest Asian legend given a western treatment on celluloid is a wondrous and entertaining action adventure that offers the first ever screen participation of Martial arts superstars Jackie Chan and Jet Li in the same film (with each doing dual roles) and the acrobatic action sequences from choreographer Wo Ping and vivid cinematography by Peter Pau who each brought distinction to "Crouching Tiger Hidden Dragon". Now has made "The Forbidden Kingdom" the perfect jump-start to the upcoming summer blockbuster movie season

Michael Angarano portrays Jason, an average teenager with a yen for kung fu movies who rents videos from a pawn shop run by its kindly, old Chinese owner, Old Hop (Jackie Chan in very heavy makeup). Where Jason happens to observe a secret room full of ancient artifacts and becomes attracted to a golden staff stick

When Jason awakens from the fall he discovers he's been transported to ancient China where he's befriended by a quartet of varied martial artist misfits, a drunken warrior, Lu Yan (Jackie Chan on a role he duplicated from one of his early imports, "The Drunken Master"), an vengeful orphan girl (Li Bing Bing), and a soldier monk (Jet Li) who teams and teach the American youth proper kung fu defense technique. While they journey through the desert, fight off a female bounty hunter and her massive army into the mountains in the clouds. In order for the youth "to fulfill the prophesy of the morals" and return the staff to its rightful owner

Derived from the traditional Chinese tale, the staff is the power source to the playful yet skillful Monkey King (Jet Li) who was tricked and turned into a stone statue during his battle with the evil Jade war lord (Collin Chou) who felt the intruder was a threat to the kingdom he was line to take over.

Jason along with his Asian cohorts can save

the kingdom by returning the staffi that would free the imprisoned Monkey King and ultimately help Jason to return home.

Even though the youth achieves a better life for himself in ancient China than in his current N.Y, life, and yet, upon his return back to his own world, Jason is given a "Karate Kid" moment by surprising chief bully, Lupo with his "acquired fighting skills."

Although entertaining enough and a dazzling action -adventure spectacle that helps further the

directorial skills of Rob Minkoff of "The Lion King" and Stuart Little" fame, "The Forbidden Kingdom" is a bit too formulated and cliché with its casting and situations.

Even though kung fu movie fans are given a pictorial homage in the opening credit to Bruce Lee and others in their fighting poses and rewarded in the script by a physical and intricate fight dance between Jackie Chan and Jet Li. Naturally, their exchange becomes a draw when it's revealed they are on the same mission with the American youth.

Still, I could not help but wonder, Why in these type of movies is the" chosen one" always an Anglo-Saxon sent to help free an oppressed race or nation? This is so familiar to the 1970's black films that suggested Blacks didn't overcome their circumstances without the help of some heroic White person leading the way. PG-13; 95min. to be cloned from personal pain and experiences he's. He plays Peter Bretter, an unfocused slacker who is a love sick composer of incidental music for a TV crime series that stars his sexy looking actress-girlfriend, Sarah Marshall (Kristen Bell) who unknown to him, has become tried of trying to change his lack of motivation.

Sarah returns to their apartment to announce her decision to end their relationship. Instantly shattered by the news, Peter Bretter represents the current trend in movie heart throb roles, a needy guy who is lacking in every way, but still retains an awkward charm.

The news of their break-up makes Peter an "emotional cripple" to the point of being unable to function without thinking of her. for all to sign and historic tree walks, led by Jim Dehorn, took visitors on a splendid tour of the famous trees and the story of how they came to be at the conservatory.

### Threat of Violence Causes Unrest At Malcom X College

Within the past year there have been many incidents involving threats or acts of violence on college campuses. First with the Virginia Tech shooting, then with the tragedy at Northern Illinois University. They were followed by the murders of two female students, one at Auburn University and the other at The University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill.

However, even with the increase of security on campus after these unfortunate incidents around the United States and here in Illinois, students at Malcolm X college were still the victims of a school violence threat yesterday morning, which resulting in the school evacuating the 900 students who were in attendance.

"It's a terrifying situation you know," said James Beacon, a student at Malcolm X. "You can never be sure of if someone is trying to be funny or if there is really the chance that a person is going to cause the student body and staff serious harm. I remember Northern Illinois had similar threats before the shootings down there, but many people wrote it off as a person attempting to cause a scene. Sadly, you see what happened in that case."

The threat, which had been revealed by a student who read it on the inside of a bathroom stall, was said to have said "prepare to die on 4-14 til the end" was taken very seriously and prompted both the Chicago Police Department and the F.B.I. to the campus, located at 1900 W. Van Buren.

"Children should not have to be worried about the threat of death when tying to get an

education and preserve the future," said Officer Winston McCall. "You can be assured that there will be stiff penalty whenever the suspect is caught, because this kind of behavior and such a despicable act cause unnecessary stress and worry to the students and staff."

Thankfully, no weapons or hazardous materials were found after a through search by both the CPD and FBI with the aid of bomb sniffing dogs. The school then re opened at 4:30, with many students happy to be back in school, knowing that they can feel safe and focus once again on education. "It's good to know that the City of Chicago has proper response techniques to ensure our safety when another person makes an attempt to put it in danger," said foreign student Payal Chawda. "I have seen many incidents on the news but never been a part of such a scary moment and hopefully never will be again."

Some students however feel that the school should have been closed, at least for the day, to allow more internal investigation. "The school closed at 9:30 and reopened at four, how much investigation can you do in seven hours, how safe can you make the perimeter and how many fears can you ease in that short amount of time," said Jasmine Q. Stuart, a transitional student at Malcolm X. "I am all for getting back in the routine of normal and trying to get people back in the flow, but not at the expense of what could have been a later attack that could have left us injured. I just feel we needed more time, although I am happy that all ended well.

# Garfield Park Basketball League Know Where Your Children Are

The Garfield Park Spring/Summer Youth Basketball League tipped off its 18<sup>th</sup> season last week and the historic Golden Dome gym fieldhouse that has been a haven for young athletes for nearly two decades is alive once again with the sounds of balls bouncing on the hardwood, referees whistles signaling infractions, and balls successfully swishing through nets, as well as clanging off rims, not so successfully.

Whether the balls fall through the net or clang off the rim is not terribly important in this league. The goal is more focused on simply enjoying the games and doing something positive, when so many counter-productive activities loom in the nearby streets. During the four months when the league is in session, area youth have something constructive to partake in that's proven to be effective in curtailing teenage trouble and violence.

Park Supervisor, Jim Hobson, has organized the Garfield Park League since its inception, and he has seen the benefits that sports and organized activities have for youngsters. Basketball is something they love, but he's open to anything that they are

interested in, as long as it's positive.

"I'm a big proponent of programming for teens and young people. The situation is such that we have to cater to things that children love to do, and sports, particularly basketball happens to be a big part of their lives," Hobson said.

Although it's not just basketball talent that's exalted in the league, it does play a big part and many fabulous basketball players have

participated in the league over the years. Ronnie Fields, the skywalker from Farragut played in the league, as did current Houston Rocket and former Manley standout Luther Head. Sherron Collins, who starred at Crane, and recently won a national championship with Kansas is still a regular at the gym when he's in town, and the list of basketball stars who've played in the league truly goes on and on.

"Sherron Collins got his christening here," said Hobson. "But the best thing is that they always come back – these are their roots, and this league is a big part of the community."

Basketball has always been very popular in Chicago's inner city, and its appeal is undisputable. But there are a host of activities that parks can provide and Hobson is open to other activities as well.

"It's more than basketball, because believe it or not basketball is not my favorite sport, softball is," Hobson said. "We have to prick the conscious of this community and find out from our children and our young people what it is that we can provide for them that will help them stay off of these streets."

The purpose of the program is to saturate a pre-designated area with roving police officers that continually monitor vehicular traffic for signs of impaired driving. Patrols also place emphasis on speeding, safety belt and alcohol-related violations. Police vehicles equipped for speed detection are deployed to apprehend speeding violators.

In the wake of increased violence reported citywide, the department also announced that it will be deploying more officers from administrative duty to crime hot spots where gang retaliations and random shootings are likely to occur.

The early deployment of police officers from desk duty is one of the commitments Mayor Daley announced as part of the 2008 budget and is just one phase of a larger, broader plan. Officers previously assigned to administrative desk duty will immediately take on patrol assignments focusing on areas where shootings and gang activity have spiked. Police also have accelerated the hiring plan of its next recruit class, which is scheduled to begin this month.

"Random shootings are the deadliest crimes against our youth and residents, and with the warmer weather ahead, the likelihood that violent crime will occur increase," said Weiss.

"By deploying these offices in the right place at the right time now, we can eliminate the potential for violence and begin identifying some of the crime patterns and violence anticipated during the upcoming summer months," Weis concluded.

#### No charges in domestic-related death

The Cook County state's attorney's office declined to file charges against a West Side man who is alleged to have beaten his daughter's boyfriend to death during a disturbance at his residence. The dead man was identified by the Cook County medical examiner's office as Swantell McKinley.

Chicago police department News Affairs spokesperson Officer Marcel Bright, told the North Lawndale Community News "The victim was committing a domestic battery against his girlfriend at a residence in the 4100 block of West Harrison Street early Saturday afternoon." Bright confirmed that the state's attorney's office reviewed the case and determined that McKinley and his girlfriend's father were "mutual combatants."

The unidentified 40-year-old father was released from custody without being charged. Initial police reports indicated McKinley was the aggressor during an altercation with his unidentified girlfriend when her unidentified father intervened. McKinley allegedly attacked the father who defended himself.

Bright said the reports did not indicate whether either combatant used a weapon. Area 4 was continuing its investigation of the incident as of press time late Tuesday.

#### Stabbing hospitalizes security guard

A security guard at a Western Avenue restaurant and bar was hospitalized in critical condition after a man he had ejected earlier returned and stabbed him repeatedly. The unidentified victim was rushed to Mt. Sinai Hospital and Medical Center where he remained late Monday while being treated for multiple stab wounds.



steer our young people toward those activities."

In the end the basketball league is all about protecting and enhancing the lives of the youth of the west side. It's not an easy task, but with the help of volunteers and Park District staff the possibilities that activities like the basketball league provide are without limit as far as molding young people and keeping them out of trouble. And in today's often violent world actually keeping them alive.

Hobson has worked with youth for most of his adult life, but before that he was a Combat Platoon Sergeant during the Vietnam Conflict and in 1968-1969 he led more than

forty men into actual combat. None of his men under his command were killed in action and he uses some of the same principles to obtain success as head of the park's programs.

In Vietnam he told his troops: "If you listen to me and remember what we did in training you have a chance of coming back alive. Sure enough they listened to me and I never lost a man. I had 47 men under my command and I never lost a single one. I don't expect to lose any in here at (Garfield Park's Golden Dome) either."

The league is free of charge and the rules and regulations aren't extensive or hard to adhere to.

"It's free, and all they have to do is to show up. All I ask is that you come out here and act like young men and women."

third floor, face reduction due to limited space on the school's first and second floors.

At a March 19 public hearing, CPS officials stated that reports indicated that there is sufficient space for both schools. The Board made its decision based on this CPS report and its shared use policy.

According to Board policy,

both schools will work with a campus manager to determine equitable use of space, so that both schools have enough space for their academic programs. Agreements are made by both principals in a memorandum of understanding in regards to school space, shared space, i.e. cafeteria and gym, designated entrances and exits, start of school day, building and custodial staff, and additional security.

"Both principals will discuss an agreement that will allow both their academic programs to succeed and maintain a safe environment," said representatives from CPS' Office of New Schools at the March 19 hearing.

CPS representatives confirmed that Burroughs II will open with 162 students grades K-2 in the 2008-09 school year and then
