A back to school parade and picnic that honors the memory of Diane Spence, community activist and legislative aide to Assistant Majority Leader, State Senator Rickey R. Hendon has been given the most intensive planning it has seen since its inception over twenty years ago. The unique addition to this event, of which during the summer months there are many across the city, is that this parade is to be eventually, equivalent to the Bud Biliken parade and has been given special attention by the Westside Service Organization (WSO). It is receiving extraordinary local grassroots and corporate support.

The parade will begin Saturday, August 22, at 9 a.m. and originate at 4949 West Madison just west of Cicero Avenue, across from Moo & Oink. Over 300 organizations plan to participate. Harry Lennix, star of Fox-TV's **DOLLHOUSE**, and currently starring in "STATE OF PLAY" with Russell Crowe and Helen Mirren will serve as the Grand Marshal for the parade. The parade will travel the following route: East on Madison Avenue to California Avenue, then South to Jackson, then West to Central Park Avenue ending on the inner drive of Garfield Park. The parade will end at 11 a.m. and then the picnic will start along with a softball game featuring The Fighting 5th, hose captain is the 5th District's Senator Rickey R. Hendon.

The Chicago Public Schools (CPS) in partnership with the Westside Service Organization (W.S.O) will distribute free school supplies along with over 100 nonprofit organizations that will set up tables on the picnic grounds for the purpose of distributing literature about their services. All food at the picnic is free, and will be provided by various sponsors including: the W.S.O., CPS, Marketfresh, Leamington Foods, Jewel Food Stores and Moo & Oink. Other contributors include: Walgreens, North Lawndale Community News, PanAmerica Performance Works and St. Anthony Hospital.

Entertainment will be provided by Earl Powell and Eptone Productions will start at 3 p.m. on the main stage at Garfield Park, featuring a variety of musical styles and performers including but not limited to: Khari Lemuel, Public Announcement, Kayla, Russoul, Liz Toussaint, Ben One, Mr. Red, Slique, Melinda Bussie and three gospel choirs. Additional entertainment provided by CPS includes: Lee England Jr., Day26 (P. Diddy's Making the Band) and MC Lyte. All festivities will conclude by 11 p.m., the official closing time of Garfield Park. Men, women and children of all ages on Chicago's West Side are invited to enjoy the fun and festivity. Dignitaries scheduled to participate in the parade include: Governor Pat Quinn, Attorney General Lisa Madigan, Secretary of State Jesse White, State Treasurer Alexi Giannoulias, Senior Adviser to the Governor Billy Ocasio, State Senators John J. Cullerton, Mattie Hunter, Kimberly Lightford, James Meeks, and Donnie Trotter; State Representative Annazette Collins; and

Aldermen Walter Burnett Jr., Ed H. Smith, Bob Fioretti and Sharon Dixon.

WSO is a not-for-profit agency that serves and assists the community in matters of housing, health, education including the welfare of children, the elderly and the disadvantaged. In addition to her political work, Ms. Spence also served on the local school council at Crane High School and was a volunteer board member for Better Life for Youth and the homeless shelter House of David. She also created the non-profit referral center for women Sister-to-Sister, organized and managed a young people's dance group known as the Ultimate Posse, and was instrumental in the coordination of countless food and clothing drives.

The Economy has made itself the number one issue with gas prices reaching almost \$5.00 per gallon and having a domino effect on everything else sold, except housing stock which experienced a terrible decline with the high rate of foreclosures. The Chicago metropolitan area reported 5,821 new foreclosure filings in December, a foreclosure rate of one new foreclosure filing for every 499 households — more than twice the national average. That brought the area's fourth quarter foreclosure total to 16,949 and its 2006 foreclosure total to 57,706, according to Realty Trac.

Even transportation on the CTA went on the rise with one day passes increasing by seventy-five cents and monthly passess increased by \$10.00 from \$75.00 to \$85.00. Those are just a few of the increases.

GOOD TIMES HAVE SERIOUS SIDE DURING WEST SIDE PARADE, PICNIC

While the good times are sure to roll throughout Garfield Park during Illinois Senator Rickey Hendon's 22nd Annual Picnic & Back to School Parade next Saturday (Aug. 22), the true platforms upon which the 2009 festivities reside are a bit more serious than the fun, games and entertainment that are expected to draw thousands to the West Side to play and party well into the night.

Primarily the event is all about focusing attention on the dawning new school year and serving as a primer for success for thousands of West Side children. More than 4,000 backpacks and starter packages of school supplies are expected be distributed to neighborhood kids, according to parade Chairman Roger Chandler.

Hendon, 55, the flamboyant Democrat who has represented the 5th District since 1992, said good fun, good food and a good time are excellent avenues to getting kids and their parents ready for a new school year.

"We want to get the children to concentrate on going back to school and give them a boost in preparing to learn when they get back to school," said the father of five. "We want them to enjoy themselves."

He added the good time element of the day also brings out the parents, increasing their participation in an occasion meant to motivate and provide the tools their children need to begin the school year successfully.

In addition to launching the return to school, this year's activities also focuses on recognizing the life and contributions of the late Diane Spence, a longtime legislative aide of Hendon, who passed away in 2006. She also served as his chief of staff while directing the planning of the parade that bears her name this year.

"It's a tribute to her that this (celebration) will be the biggest ever," Hendon said. "Her guidance was responsible for the tremendous success we've experienced with this event, and honoring her gives even greater meaning to my commitment to its continued success. We've overcome a lot obstacles to get here."

Presented by the Westside Services Organization (WSO), a local non-profit, the festivities begin at 9 a.m. with a parade that begins on West Madison Street across from Moo& Oink and heads east to California before going south to Jackson, where it travels back west to Central Park Avenue before ending on the inner drive of Garfield Park.

Harry Lennix, the star of Fox-TV's "Dollhouse," will serve as grand marshal of the parade, which will feature floats from over 309 organizations, stated in a breakfast meeting with four police districts.

More than 100 non-profits will also set up tables providing information regarding their activities and services.

Free food and beverages comprise the picnic that follows the parade as a host of local talent provides a variety of free entertainment. A softball game between "Old and New School" players of Hendon's Fighting 5th ASA softball team accompanies the picnic. Hendon says he may also play.

The fun is expected to last until 11 p.m. After all the revelry Hendon, the General Assembly's Assistant Majority Leader, said he plans to roll up his sleeves and get to work in Springfield on behalf of the children supported by the event.

"We want to get more money for education, and get the students the tools they need to get better," he said. "I will again be strongly supporting Senator (James) Meeks



Local Chef Seeks to Cater 2 U

Take a ton of passion, mix it with unlimited optimism, throw in a wellspring of talent and determination and you will have the makings for a dining experience that "melts in your mouth and not in your hands" when you allow Let Me Cater 2 U do the cooking for your special event.

Add the saucy talents of a statuesque professional chef who answers to the name Candylicious and prepare to fill your plate and pamper your palate with cuisine that taste like it just came from grandma's oven. Because sometimes, when Kanisha McBeath is slaving over a hot stove to feed patrons of her nearly year-old catering business, she is literally home cooking in her grandmother's kitchen.

"My grandma lives in the same building I do, so when I need an extra oven I use hers and my mother's too, sometimes," explained McBeath, who has since last December operated her growing catering enterprise from her home in Maywood. "Someday, I would love to own my own banquet hall to go with my cooking. That would be my dream come true."



Will Burton (Gaelan Connell) is more than a loner. He's a social outcast ostracisized by his high school in Cincinnati.

Even when his sympathetic mother, Katherine Lisa Kudrow) gets a new job from a relative that leads them to relocate to a new start in New Jersey. Will view the transition as being "a different kid and scene with the same life results as he has in Cincinnati."

However, Will's anonymity at Van Buren High School leads him to the cafeteria. Where during lunch, a student rally breaks out for the school's only band participating in the upcoming "Band Slam" competition.

The only other person not sharing in the enthusiasm, but falls closer to Will's impartial demeanor is "Sa5m" (Sam with a silent 5") played by Vanessa Hudgens dressed in morbid black outfit and hair who reads a lot that seems to indicate

a protective person with some emotional scars to hide.

Then soon after, Will meets lovely excheerleader, Charlotte Brown (Alyson Michalka) who feels might improve his social status for the first time ever.

While Will never questions why this popular girl would take interest in a dweeb like him; who begins their friendship from helping her with the school's day care center and soon after lures him to check out her new garage band in development

Also, Brown happens to be the ex-girlfriend and member to handsome Ben Wheatley (Scott Porter), the lead guitar and singer in the school band, "Glory Dogs" that's competing in Band Slam.

Still, Graff's "Bad Slam" is a film that shows and tells teens not to hide behind their personal misery that disallows from being the person they are and can be, without being preachy or saccharine about it.

APERFECT GETAWAY

(***)

"A Perfect Getaway" is a "better than anticipated" thriller done with a clever twist from writer-director David Twohy in his strongest screen work in years. From first getting our By David H. Schultz, film critic attention with the offbeat teen sci-fi flick, "The Arrival"; Twohy goes from a futuristic apocalyptical setting in "The Chronicles of Riddick" and "Pitch Black" to a more scenic topical island paradise.

From the opening sequence of a recorded wedding reception on a digital camera; Steve Zahn and Milla Jovovich play Cliff and Cydney Anderson, a young newlywed couple arriving on the isle of Honolulu for their honeymoon vacation.

Writer-director Twohy begins tinkering from this simple premise that begins to indicate a sinister edge that is present, but as yet to reveal itself. Literally, when the couple's rental jeep happens to run over the newspaper headline; "Young Couple Butchered in Honolulu". In which the killers would remove their victims' teeth among other things.

Then two other couples are added to the scenario. First, Cliff and Cydney driving along the dirt road happen upon a hitchhiking couple, a friendly southern woman, Cleo (Marley Shelton) with her gruff boyfriend, Kale (Chris Hemsworth)

Another tone is set when Cliff doesn't feel too comfortable offering the couple a ride because of Kale's intense demeanor that happens to be duly notice to loudly reject the invitation and makes Cleo get out of the vehicle.

Soon after Cliff and Cydney encounter s a more "friendliest" yuppie-type couple, Nick (Timothy Olyphant) and Gina (Kiele Sanchez) bare naked in a lake near a waterfall. The more Nick and Gina talk the weirder they seem. Still they seem to become Cliff and Cydney's unofficial tour guide during the joint trek together.

Beyond the film's set-up, Twohy delivers a strong dialogue presence throughout his characters that touches several levels from being insightful about our human nature, personal and observational about show biz as a writer as it relates to life and pop culture and unassuming clues that could mean a lot later.

When Cliff reveals himself as an aspiring

screenwriter and Nick seems to suggest he has some special op training by mentioning he's "hard to kill". (A neat reference that suggests vital information that comes into play later in the film While Nick provides far fetched antidotes that he's trying to convince Cliff's script. Later, Nick happens to "stump" Cliff with a simple catch phrase movie line.

Then later what isn't known by the killers that the digital camera happens to capture their blurred images at the murder site. Still, Twohy plays it coy until he almost ruins his surprise through his split screen imagery and overwrought flashback sequences. Even though these cinematic techniques do become a little irritating and doesn't clarify enough.

Still, "A Perfect Getaway" holds its own through its tricky finale. But at least the film avoid falling into a slasher movie mentality used to fill in the revealing film piece that fills in certain aspects purposely left out that almost gives one a small headache, leading into a water battle on a small boat between the real victim and killer.

"A Perfect Getaway" is not by any stretch of its imagination "perfect", but it is a good popcorn movie an audience can delightfully get caught up and chew on.

This Space Invites 21st Century Solutions to Our Black Issues

You know what? I got so worked up about he frenzy surrounding the non-issue arrest of Harvard professor Dr. Henry Gates that I forgot ny manners before speaking my piece on the natter in this space last week.

So please allow me to correct the oversight and introduce myself and my desire to make LANE CHANGE a forum to explore the host of ssues and obstacles confronting 21st Century Black America on the West Side of Chicago and beyond in attempt to give voice to a new perspective and new solutions in the ongoing effort to lift our community out of the quagmire of violence, apathy and disillusion that currently threatens to fragment and destroy black children, black families and black communities beyond repair in the United States.

Mainly though, I just want to create a weekly space here where everyday black people can receive and share a small measure of genuine concern for our issues expressed beyond the veneer of politics and commercial exploitation.

I write this column as a volunteer and with he disclaimer that I speak for myself only and what I say in no way should be viewed as the ppinion or a reflection of policy at North Lawndale Community Newspaper or its publisher Strategic Human Services.

I bring to this forum the experiences and knowledge I have gained during my 51 years of ife as a black American male. Born and raised in Mississippi, I have served as a combat correspondent in the United States Marine Corps and bring more than 30 years of journalism and writing experience to this effort. I am also he father of three adult sons, and one nine-year-old son who I am currently raising on the West Side as a single dad. I am a grandfather and two-time father-in-law, and I have a large

extended family of siblings and their children as well as a sole surviving uncle.

I have lived through some of America's worst history and hope to live to see the day when its future is not consumed by the hatred and narrow self interest that defines our curren national dilemma on race and justice. I am trying in this modest attempt to help bring about that day.

I have known tragic loss as well as love and hatred in my past, and I have settled for love to guide my future. I am a Christian without the religion. By that I mean I live by the spiritual teachings of Jesus Christ and His example of love for my God and neighbors and not by the rituals and tenets of any the particular "denominations" as they all exist directly ir opposition to Christ's admonition that a house divided against itself cannot stand.

As I said last week, for far too long black folk have remained chained and led by the notion of being victims in this country. Our leaders tell us how much we are deserving of guilt-driven trickle-down remedies to the issues confronting us when we actually already possess the self-affirming legacy of heroes in our DNA as well as within the history of our walk in America.

Heroes don't ask others to solve their problems; heroes are problem solvers. And it is about time we step up to our responsibility—The Black Man's Burden—to not only get our own house in order, but to help transform the land that makes us who we are better for all Americans.

Those who suffer persecution at the hands of another are called to freedom not just to merely to make better service of their own lives. Rather they owe it to their deliverance to also rescue





Rachel McAdams and Eric Bana in The Time Travelers

The film opens on Christmas Eve with a truck/car crash that kills Henry's mother that Henry as a child is warped out of the accident. Where the child is confronted by himself as an adult (Eric Bana) who console the child and makes him aware of his future and ability.

With some minor location filming in Chicago, the "stranded and alone" adult Henry happens to enter a library after his lakefront jog. Where he meets and recognizes the adult Claire (Rachel McAdams). Naturally, as Henry travels between the past and present, there are some awkward moments initially before Claire understand as she falls in love

Eric Bana and Rachel McAdams may a formidable couple for this fantasy romance. Ron Livingston plays Rachel's married best friend whose concern for her when she agrees to marry Henry who even briefly time travels before the wedding ceremony for the in-laws to suddenly notice his gray hair lines.

The turning point when the audience is supposed to get their hankies ready is when it's learned that Henry is dying. But in the finale, there's the notion that death is finally when you are in love.

But I really didn't feel a sense of a story, just the pretense. "The Time Traveler's Wife" might satisfy enough who read the book, but the movie felt repetitious and ridiculous at times. But you pay attention in the 3 credits the screenwriter Bruce Joel Rubin, also wrote "Ghost". We can better understand what this movie was aiming for. It's rather unfortunate that it comes up short, that the film doesn't translate enough emotion and depth into its adequate proceedings.


