According to Ms. Lavelle, 36,000 parking meters in Chicago were bought by Chicago Pakring Meters, LLC (CPM). The private hired by CPM to run the operation. LAZ installs, operates, and maintains the parking meter equipment.

Also, according to Ms. Lavelle, when calling to report a problem with a parking box give your name, location and the I.D. number on the box. The reporting number is 1-877-242-7901. If the parker is wrongfully ticketed, they can get a record of complaint of malfunction because the box is electronically monitored. Problems are discovered right away and repairs can be done in hours - not days or weeks like parking meters.

LAZ has a team of technicians that are immediately dispatched to repair the problems. If the box runs out of receipt paper, the machine will alert the central office to say that it is out of paper. The parker can also call the number on the box to report the malfunction, then a confirmation number will be given to provide verification if the parker gets a ticket.

follow the simple instructions that

are displayed on the machine's front screen. The amount of time you have for parking depends on how much money you add to the pay boxes. After depositing the desired amount, press the "receipt button" to receive a receipt. You must place this receipt on your dashboard; it shows the date, the time at which you parked, and the time of expiration. Be sure the receipt stays on the dashboard when shutting your door. If a gust of wind coming from your car door blows the receipt on the floor, you can be ticketed for not feeding the box or expired meter.


If you wrongfully get a parking ticket, you can contest it by submitting the confirmation number to the hearing officer. The hearing officers have access to computers, where they can look up information on when the pay box was reported broken and the time you received the parking ticket. If the facts line up, the ticket will be dismissed.

The Chicago metropolitan area reported 5,821 new foreclosure filings in December, a foreclosure rate of one new foreclosure filing for every 499 households — more than twice the national average. That brought the area's fourth quarter foreclosure total to 16,949 and its 2006 foreclosure total to 57,706, according to Realty Trac.

DVD-TV SPOTLIGHT; THE SHIELD: SEASON 7: THE FINAL ACT (\*\*\*\*) Moving like a runaway train, "The Shield" didn't act like a regular TV series nearing its end. In fact, the series felt like it was just getting started. Creator Shawn Ryan's gritty ground breaking cop series' finale finds detective Vic Mackey in a race against time like no cop has ever been in this thirteen episode, four-disc collection set.

With his past crimes catching up to him, Mackey looks to cut a deal that would move from the force to the Feds. Meanwhile he chases after his

fugitive partner, Shane (Walter Goggins), who killed a fellow cop from their Strike force in a "Bonnie and Clyde," on-the-lam scenario with pregnant wife and sick son.

Under intense direction and sharp writing "The Shield" not only raised the bar, but it also broke through it. It is so good and unforgettably powerful that you'll be wishing there was more. Don't fret though; this package does contain fifty-one amazing deleted scenes. Hopefully with this DVD release, "The Shield" will earn many deserved Emmy nominations for its gritty and intense "swan song." Chicago-born actor Michael Chiklis earned an Emmy and Golden Globe award for this role; he delivers a memorable TV character and deserves iconic status, right next to Tony Soprano. Chiklis is the catalyst of the series and is propelled by a superb supporting cast that includes CCH Pounder.

REVOLUNTIONARY ROAD (\*\*\*\*) The unraveling of the American Dram during the 1950s is well chronicled through strong performances by Leonard DiCaprio and Kate Winslet in their first screen reunion since "Titanic." The two play a seemingly perfect couple who escape big city hassles for the suburban life. However, they can't cease the growing desperation in their lives. April (Winslet) understands their dissatisfaction better than her unfulfilled husband, Frank (DiCaprio), who thinks they can re-energize their marriage by

THE INTERNATIOINAL (\*\*) Banks are the bad guys here, but as timely as this movie sounds "The International" turns out to be a weak and confusing, globe-trotting investment. Interpol agent Clive Owen and Manhattan D.A. Naomi Watts team up to find an insider (Amin Mueller Stahl) to help crumble an ultra sleek banking institution in Luxemburg. The bank operates an assassination bureau within its larger operation in order to protect their secretive weaponry deals and money laundering with corrupt third world parties. R; 118min. FIRED UP (\*1/2) Whatever its intentions, this teen comedy about a pair of high school football Lotharios who "man up" for the cheerleading team, only leads to a pale rip-off reminder to "Bring It On". The guys use their new frontier to expand their sexual playing field until the lovely squad leader becomes suspicious. The guys alternate from their womanizing beliefs in a typical cheer competition finale. Cheap humor at the expense of greater sexual openness leads to a rather lame comedy frolic. 

### AT THE FLICKS

THE TAKING OF PELHAM 1-2-3 (\*\*\*) This is an adequate, updated remake to the 1974 Walter Matthau - Robert Shaw action thriller that has been given a descent and contemporary facelift with hi-tech influences of the internet and references to recent headlines. It weaves together to form an intricate tale of an NYC subway hijacking.

John Travolta churns out the kind of gleeful villainy he has done before in "Face-Off" and "Broken Arrow" plays Ryder, a wild man that fronts a team that uncouples passengers from their train.

The hostage situation is realized at the massive NYC monitoring headquarters by recently demoted MTA officer turned train dispatcher, Walter Garber. Garber is played by Denzel Washington in Walter Matthau's original role.

After dismissing an interfering with the NYPD negotiator, Camnoneti (John Turturro) that led to the motormen's death; Ryder drafts Garber with the responsibility of contacting the Mayor (James Gandolfini) who is eager to

Otherwise, Ryder intends to kill a hostage for every minute after the money is late in its arrival.

"Payback": here, he reworks the script based on John Godley's bestseller with an infusion of disclosed computer information that Ryder uses to make a criminal connection with Garber. Garber's demotion stems from being under investigation for taking a corporate bribe in a train deal with Japan.

During the course of the film, the computer begins to pay a secondary part in the drama of the subway's incident being streamed online. How come the bad guys don't catch this and the good guys do is one the film's sour points. This creates a scenario for Washington's non-heroic character to eventually find the courage to vindicate himself for his past discretion.

However, it is clear that what gives this remake its distinction (besides the hi-tech influences) is the strong performances between Travolta and Washington. The actors deliver a psychological, intellectual "cat and mouse" game with their dynamic characters. LAND OF THE LOST (\*\*1/2) Will Ferrell's offbeat sensibilities and physical comedy provide the right mix for this quirky yet entertaining remake of creators-producers Sid and Marty Krofft's often hokey 1970s Saturday morning TV series. Ferrell portrays Dr. Rick Marshall, an eccentric paleontologist who is obsessed with time and space travel through a warping machine. He is motivated by a desire to solve our green concerns with fossil fuel from and alternative world.

Considered a quack for his radical theories presented to "Today" show host Matt Lauer (in a cute cameo bit), Marshall's belief reduces him to teaching biology class to elementary kids.

He is soon visited by a drop-out student from Cambridge, Holly Cantrell (Anna Friel). Holly supports Marshall's theory and she presents him with proof through a fossil rock sample with a lighter case imprint.

Holly forces Marshall to test his machine with propels into action with recorded show tunes. Before operating the machine, Marshall takes Holly to a remote location in the middle of

Marshall and Holly activate the machine on the ride with Will Writer Brain Helgeland who wrote "L.A. Confidential" and and the trio is transported to an alternative universe where past and present artifacts are intermingle with dinosaurs. The alternate world includes a sensitive T-Rex, monkey people and their exiled prince, Chaka (played by Jorma Taccone) and lizard men led by a mad scientist, Enik (John Boylan). Enik tricks Marshall into believing another adversary, The Znay (voiced by Leonard Ninoy) plots to destroy the universe and can only be stopped with Marshall's device, which by this point, has been carried off to a nesting volcano.

Of course, the film is hokey at times, but it's visually fun to watch and hilarious by the not-so accurate opinions and blunders caused by Ferrell's zany character.

The original "Land of the Lost" is known as a kid's series that many adults watched and reportedly hallucinated over through drug use. In trying to appease adults and kids, this new incarnation tends to more closely reflect Ferrell movie quality. Some of the vulgar language used is something adults with kids under ten should be aware of and consider. Still, the film turns out to be an offbeat and entertaining comedy/fantasy adventure.
