Edna Stewart Day Salutes Lifetime of Serving Others

Perhaps embattled golfer Tiger Woods could take a few lessons in integrity from Edna Stewart, who also knows a thing or two about second chances.

On a day during Black History Month when Woods, one of the most heralded non-white Americans on the planet, was copping a mea culpa for past indiscretions at a somber Florida golf clubhouse, Stewart, a local, unsung African American heroine on Chicago's West Side had no apologies to make last Friday in a festive homage to a lifetime of great service and great food.

Joined by her family, local dignitaries, friends, customers and a crowd of local news media, Ms. Edna, the iconic matron and long-time owner of Edna's Soul Food Restaurant at 3175 W. Madison, was basking in the glow of unabashed appreciation at the diner as Gov. Pat Quinn proclaimed February 19, 2010 "Edna Stewart Day" in Illinois.

"It is indeed an honor and a great pleasure to be honored by Gov. Pat Quinn and the state of Illinois," Stewart said while sitting with friends and family before the 10:30 a.m. presentation that began with the governor's arrival in the midst of the breakfast rush at the restaurant.

The proclamation, hailed as Quinn's celebration of Black History Month 2010, gave recognition to a indefatigable little woman, who contributed in no small measure to some of that history herself.

"Black History Month gives us a time to reflect upon those who have made significant positive contributions to the African-American community in Illinois, said Quinn, who touted West Side roots of his own during his presentation remarks. "I want to commend Edna Stewart for her remarkable impact on Illinois, devoting over four decades to serving delicious soul food and second chances on the West Side of

comments during the event, as did Alderman Ed Smith (D-28th) and former Cook County Board President Bobbie Steele. The Rev. Jackson and U.S. Congressman Danny Davis (D-7th) sent proxies to convey their appreciation for Stewart and her steadfast commitment to her customers and community service.

Boldly laying claim to serving "The Best Biscuits on Earth," Edna's Soul Food Restaurant opened on March 9, in the turbulent spring of 1966. Just weeks earlier, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. had moved his family into a dilapidated slum apartment in the North Lawndale neighborhood to highlight the plight of the poor in Northern cities.

The scouts for King's entourage quickly learned about new, little place on Kedzie Avenue that specialized in the Nobel Laureate's favorite farefried chicken and biscuits.

With that advantage, Edna's became a welcome refuge of comfort and hospitality for King and his freedom fighters after their long, sometimes harrowing marches through hostile and violent all-white Chicago neighborhoods to demand an end to the slums and ghettos blacks and the other poor were relegated to by unfair housing policies and practices under then Mayor Richard J. Daley's administration

And since virtually feeding the Civil Rights



LANE CHANGE: Honest Dialogue Needed In Conversation on Race

I would respond to the writer of the letter in last week's edition that called my previous LANE CHANGE comments that race still sets the tone of American politics "inappropriate" by pointing to two recent political developments.

First, the U.S. Supreme Court recently reversed nearly a century of legal precedents by deciding to permit corporations to contribute unlimited financial resources to promoting the politicians and politics supporting their interests.

Secondly, nearly half of Arizona's legislature is sponsoring a proposed law to require presidential candidates to submit documents proving they are qualified to be president if they wish to appear on the ballot in that state in 2012. The measure is openly supportive of the notion that President Obama has yet to satisfactorily prove he is a U.S. citizen by birth.

Again, before going any further, the views expressed in LANE CHANGE are my own and are in no way endorsed by the publisher or supporters or the North Lawndale Community Newspaper.

Nor are they intended to target or offend anyone personally or any ethnic group prejudicially. I have no agenda or ax to grind against any body or any group of bodies. What I say here is simply my honest interpretation of what I see and know from my 51 years of lifelong experience as a Black American in the United States.

And I welcome any debate regarding my comments in any forum offering the opportunity for a constructive exchange of views for and/or against what I say in this space.

That said, I recount the two recent occurrences above merely to highlight my earlier point that little has truly changed in America since slavery when it comes to the instinctive emotions of fear and insecurity that race provokes.

The reality of a black president is spawning a white backlash against government itself as the same toxic environment of fear and insecurity that accompanies injustice anywhere still runs rampant in the United States and is growing ever more virulent as I write. Not because this country founded by Anglo-Saxons has moved beyond race,

but rather because today, government in America wears the face of a black male, the ultimate American boogeyman.

There is a growing, polarizing tension enveloping our nation between the races because of Obama's election and the looming fight for the White House in 2012. And any position denying that fact is not based in current or past American history.

In my opinion, the trauma to the national consciousness wrought by the race relations writ into the U.S. Constitution is akin to the damaged done to Jaycee Dugard by her kidnapper and rapist for the 18 years of her imprisonment, which included giving birth to the daughters Phillip Garrido, her tormentor.

Today Dugard is free of the beast who degraded her humanity and for nearly two decades, stole her and her heritage from the home and life she knew as a young child.

But do any of us who are aware of this young woman's tragic circumstances think she will ever truly "move beyond" the damaged done to her life simply because she now has her own responsibility for it? Can her children ever truly live beyond the truth of their own tortured heritage?

Only God knows if they may eventually heal to a degree that the knowledge of their experiences will become a less determining factor in their futures. Verily, only an escape from reality itself could even attempt to wipe the slate clean.

Each of the innocent victims in that tragedy will probably require years of intense

clinical therapy to successfully cope with what they have already endured and the demons they will surely face going forward. Their healing will be found in their ability to cope with reality of their experience, rather than by avoiding the awful truth of its occurrence.

Thus, it must be also with black

and white Americans in facing the violent and destructive legacy of race relations the United States—a hundred years ago or just yesterday. And here too, only the intense clinical therapy of an honest, nonjudgmental and apolitical dialogue between the victimized descendents—both black and white--of American Slavery and

its aftermath up to even today, can begin to effectively counteract the insidious fear and insecurity that continue to define the 21st Century national state of race relations in this country. And as it is in any attempt to cope with an unpleasant fact of life, it never helps to deny the problem exists.

and Chicago Freedom movements during King's time on the West Side, Stewart's fine cooking has satisfied the soul food palate of all who has eaten at the small, cozy eatery, now located just east of the Madison-Kedzie intersection. Rev. Jackson and Rosa Parks are among the many Civil Rights Era luminaries who also whetted their appetites at Edna's during a time when many of those she fed had only IOU slips to pay her with.

"Those kids would never have any money, recalled Stewart, who was joined by her son Melvin, sisters Alice McCommon and Judy Mitchell, a retired circuit court judge, and brother Sam Mitchell Jr. and a host of other family and friends to celebrate her very own day. "We had a large jar in the place where they would put IOU slips in, and we said we would redeem them later.

"But we never worried about the jar. We knew they didn't have the money. But I just appreciated being able to give something back to the movement for what they were doing for us during those days."

Today the 71-year-old Stewart is battling cancer as she continues to build on a legacy that includes offering more than 100 former criminal offenders jobs during her 44 years in business. And Edna's Restaurant remains a neighborhood institution for good eating and good service as well as a meeting place where the current Mayor Daley and many

others of Chicago's and nearly all of the West Side's major movers and shakers come to discuss "big ideas."

However, "It's the small people she has helped who are the real testaments to Edna's dedication to service," her brother, Sam Mitchell Jr. said in a conversation before the governor arrived.

"I mean, [Edna] has received a lot of honors and awards from powerful people all over the country. She has served a lot of dignitaries over the years. But she has remained consistent in that she appreciates everybody the same.

"From the president on down to the janitor of the building, she always treated them all with the same quality of concern and service."

"I've had a good run," Stewart remarked when summing up the history she has made and supported during the remarkable endurance record of Edna's Soul Food Restaurant.

Recognizing the achievement her very own day in Illinois as primarily the culmination of her "pleasure in meeting and serving people," Stewart added the challenge of working 20-hour days, 365 days a year for four decades to consistently provide good, quality food and service to her many customers over years has been more than compensated for by the reward of "just being able to do it after 44 years—and still satisfy people.

"That's what it has all about."

In her informative brochure Pastor Grant says..."I grew-up on the West Side of Chicago. "Street gangs and drugs took over and seemed to run the neighborhood"...


... "almost everyone I grew-up with is either dead, in jail, or is mentally ill"...



THE CRAZIES (**1/2) A descent revision of George Romero's 1973 film that reshapes the initial premise of a biological plague that hits s small town and the townspeople's rebellion against the Army that tries to contain them

The film is structured somewhat like the original; when during a little league baseball game in the tiny Iowa township of Ogden Marsh. Sheriff Dutten (Timothy Olyphant) and his slightly redneck deputy, Russell (Joe Anderson) observe and tries to halt a former town drunk who walks onto the play field with a shotgun and a blank facial expression

When he raises the gun, the sheriff is forced to shoot him dead. He thinks the man was drunk. But the medical examiner reveals there was no alcohol in his body. Soon after, a farmer with the same facial expression locks his wife and son in the closet and sets their house on fire,

Later, some local hunters happen to find a dead pilot in the swamp water without his plane. Facing three deaths within 48 hrs, the sharp minded sheriff leads a boating investigation that uncovers the sunken airplane underneath their boat.

Sensing there is something wrong with the water, Dutten borrows a moments from "Jaws: when the town mayor refuses to agree with the sheriff's' request to cut off the water supply from the lake. But Dutten does it anyway, but it's too late.

Soon after the film shifts into high gear when the US army troops wearing gas mask invade the town explaining nothing. They begin to quarantine the residents that leads to Sheriff Dutten being separated from his pregnant doctor- wife, Judy (Radha Mitchell) whose been taken to a makeshift hospital to be examined.

It soon becomes apparent that this unexplained epidemic has the military unable to tell the difference between who is contaminated and whose not So they just shoot to kill anyone that walking around and driving a vehicle that wasn't booted, In order to contain the infected resident from spreading...

While in the makeshift hospital where women are strapped to beds for the night; Judy and her friend and medical assistant, Becca (Danielle Panabaker) manage to delayed being killed by one of these "crazies", in time to be rescued by Sheriff Dutten and his deputy, Russell

From this, the foursome begin their survivalist

odyssey; trying to find a form of transportation that might pass the military checkpoints along the highway to escape the quarantined town. This allows for creative moments of shocking danger, gore and off beat humor.

Such as Sheriff Dutten's encounter with one of the crazies in the hospital with an electric hand saw that runs amuck toward him Later followed by a car wash sequence of terror and amusement that are clever modification over the original.

Along with the real reason behind the epidemic that was different from the original film; revealed as a bio war testing error done by the U.S. military. And climaxes with the sheriff and his wife in a race against time in a truck before the town gets nuked. These improvements to the original premise subsequently offer the kind of moral warning of what we are doing

Full of shocks and bloody gore, "The Crazies" is a smart and scary horror film that manages to be made better over the initial version; with an apocalyptic approach in this survivalist odyssey more entertaining to watch. R; 88min. An Overture Films Release -Presented at selected theaters

COP OUT (*1/2) What was intended to be a throwback to those 1980's interracial buddy team action comedies that started with "48Hrs." through "Lethal Weapon" and I thought was buried after the Chris Tucker- Jackie Chan disappointment, Rush

This silly, retread offering, "Cop Out" turns into a "bust" of its own; that also happens to star one of the movie genre's exponents, Bruce Willis who teamed with Damon Wayans in director Tony Scott's 1991's "The Last Boy Scout".

Now, "Cop Out"; is suppose to represent a modern transition of the buddy movie genre into today's "bromance" action comedy. In which Bruce Willis and Tracy Morgan are clearly no Riggs and Murtaugh portraying a 9 yr. veteran police detective duo, Jimmie Monroe and Paul Hodges who bicker and complain like a married couple while chasing the bad guys.

Well, excuse me that label doesn't change what their characters resemble already while trying to bust a Mexican drug operation in Brooklyn. Because the duo are partnered enough to know each other's personal problems.

Morgan who follows the character formula of the

buddy movie genre as the hyped up, loud mouth, jive talking black who happens here to be paranoia with fear and concern over his wife's suspected infidelity with the next door neighbor

Willis keeping the straight face has the problem of paying for his daughter's upcoming wedding that would help clean up his "dead beat dad' image with his ex-wife who's re-married to a wealthy husband ready to foot the bill.

But the financial plan is in jeopardy, when the cop duo happens to botch a drug stakeout that gets them suspended from pay and duty for 30 days. So Jimmie, whose also a hobbyist has to try to sell his valuable baseball card to cover his daughter's wedding.

However, when. Jimmie begins to make the transaction to sell the card to a sports memorabilia store owner. The store is robbed right under Hodges standing outside by one of two men played by Sean William Scott as a glib talking cat burglar, Dave. Whom I suppose is the new Joe Pesci from "Lethal Weapon 2'

Scott's character ends up somehow becomes an

unofficial buddy to the cops in their quest to recover the card that was sold in exchange for drugs to a ruthless Latin drug kingpin, "Poor Boy" (Juan Hernandez) whose hires with intend to double cross Monroe and Hodges to retrieve his jacked Benz that has a valuable and sexy cargo in its trunk that witness a gangland shooting and possess an incriminating ledger on a flash drive connected to a crucifix necklace

The film gets more ridiculous that's only occasionally amusing. It's not wonder that allegedly Will Ferrell and Mark Wahlberg were once attacked to this film project. But even stranger than that. Actor-director Kevin Smith of "Silent Bob" fame who recently was in the news fort being too fat for a Southwest airline flight and who last directed the 2008 comedy "Zack and Miri Make a Porno"

Smith obviously knew he was working from a bad script, but he had an obligation to make it better. Instead, Smith makes it worse by increasing the body count among the Latinos in stereotypical drug and thug gangster roles that won't make this movie endearing

Another backward and blatant example of minority misrepresentation without character balance that does nothing but bore us with disdain for the lack of consideration in the script and direction. R; 90min. A Warner Bros, Pictures Release – Presented at selected theaters

THE GHOST WRITER (***)
"The Ghost Writer" is a shallow yet fairly
intriguing exercise from exiled filmmaker
Roman Polanski that feels too drawn out
for too long in the first half. While begins
to show some interest and energy in its
last hour that almost salvages this modest
effort with its diverse cast.

Based on Robert Harris' novel who co wrote the script with Polanski that bears possible similarities to a real life political scandal. The film begins without fanfare at a ferry boat dock. Where the dead body of Michael McAra washes ashore. McAra had just finished the manuscript memoirs on controversial, former British Prime minister, Adam Lang (well played by Pierce Brosnan).

The American publisher who purchase the right for \$10 million are in a rush to recoup their money. But they first need to find another ghost writer to punch up McAra's tedious treatment.

Ewan McGregor seems to sleep walk part of his role of a successful British ghost writer whose awaken for this once in a lifetime opportunity from his agent; Rick (Jon Berthal) who meets up with him for an interview at U.S. based Rhinehart Publishing Co.

Where one British executive doesn't think he's right for the job. But publishing boss, John Maddox (played by a bald headed James Belushi) who questions McGregor , along with Lang's D.C. attorney (Timothy Hutton) who later gives him a different manuscript to look over.

Regardless, Maddox hires "the Ghost" because he can be quick to meet the one month deadline.

Still, "The Ghost" (Ewan McGregor) should have realized he was getting into more than he bargained for. When he's mugged outside his apartment building by two motorcyclists for the transcript they thought belong to McAra that was given

him by Lang's attorney.

This sets a tone, we hardly feel because Polanski usually doesn't distinguish himself enough in his films. Of course, this also sets Polanski apart from most filmmakers. And "The Ghost Writer" is no exception.

More character driven to develop its story. "The Ghost" arrives at the coastal retreat to find McAra's locked manuscript and Lang tightly guarded under around the clock security.

The film begins to get interesting when the news media exposes Lang's involvement in authorized secret torture and war crimes that leads "The Ghost" into an investigation that shows his ghost writer predecessor discovered something incriminating against Lang that is somewhere revealed in the manuscript that "The Ghost" is being rushed by the publisher to complete in half the initial time.

"The Ghost Writer" is a film about deception and corruption without the espionage edge Probably because director Roman Polanski doesn't inject much distinctive style or substance into the proceedings. The film's first half that sets up the characters and background the situation that leads into The Ghost's investigation is a little mysterious but more pedestrian. Until the performances begin to click when McGregor's character travel to meet with Paul Emmett (Tom Wilkinson) who acts like he doesn't the answers when he does. And soon after their visit has "The Ghost" followed.

Then an assassination attempt occurs at the airport on Lang's life by a disgruntled British man who tries to pump "The Ghost" earlier in the film for Lang's whereabouts at a pub.

But its after The Ghost' completes his work on the manuscript that leads to the publishing firm hosting a reception. Where "The Ghost" realizes what McAra discovered is written within the first ages of the manuscript.

"The Ghost Writer" is far from being a bad or boring film, just a film under Polanski's somewhat flat direction that should have been better and memorable than it is. R; 128min. A Summit Entertainment Picture release - Presented at selected theaters
